

She then proceeded to explain how foreign objects should be removed. A fascinating look at a very common ailment for patients that work outside in windy conditions.

The ear irrigation set came in handy this weekend. A patient presented with a loss in hearing. It was so acute for him that he was concerned. Using the ear irrigation and wax softening drops, Dr Stewart removed a large plug in the patient's ear. That patient was so relieved and happy at the outcome that he was happy to have the other ear checked. All good.
